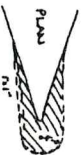
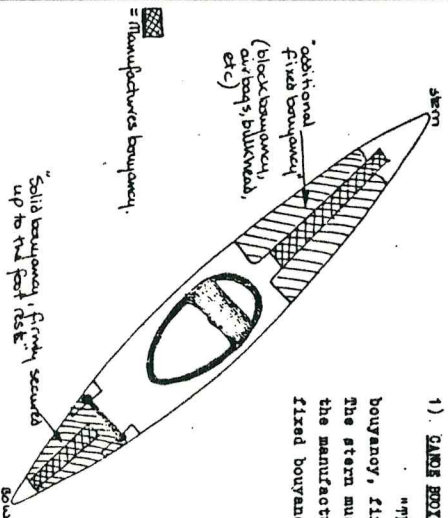


B.C.U. SUPR COMMITTEE.
Additional competition rules. (to have effect from 1st September 1982.)

1) SAME FOYAJEKI. (INC' SUPR-KAYAKS)

"The bows must be fitted with solid bouyanoy, firmly secured, up to the footrest. The stern must have the spaces each side of the manufacturers block filled with additional fixed bouyanoy."



In this example the addition of a solid moulded end to a sharp point, achieves the desired shape without having to shorten the draft. Such solid moulded additions for surfing must be firmly secured & able to withstand cropping, etc.



2) POINTED ENDS. (ALL CRAFT)

- a) "All surfing craft must have a minimum radius of 1" (allowing for a $\frac{1}{2}$ " of protruberance) in the plan view, at both ends.
- b) "All surfing craft must have a minimum radius of $\frac{3}{4}$ " (allowing for a $\frac{1}{2}$ " of protruberance) in cross-section, at both ends.
- c) "Slalom boats may be a minimum overall length of 3.90 metres in surf contests."

These new rules should be seen in the spirit they were intended--- to make the craft safer in an impact with another person by abolishing the sharp protruding ends. In fibre, beach marshall's will be supplied with metal templates to the desired dimensions.

CRAFT NOT MEETING THESE NEW REQUIREMENTS

MAY NOT BE USED IN B.C.U. SUPR CONTESTS.

In this example, rule (c) allows the canoe to be shortened to achieve the desired end shape. Such shortening would allow slalom boats from competing in slalom competitions unless the end could be refixed!
